

# JANUARY CUP RULES

Valid as of 4<sup>TH</sup> January 2024

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## 1. Name, Structure and Fees of the Competition

- a. The name of the competition shall be "Isle of Man Basketball January Cup" or "Cup Competition" for short.
- b. The Cup Competition shall run between January and February of 2024.
- c. Team registration for the Cup Competition shall close not less than one day prior to the start of the competition.
- d. Teams shall not be required to pay a registration fee.
- e. The Cup Competition shall be structured as a pooled round robin and conclude with play-off finals.
- f. The outcome of the pooled Round Robin will be used as the basis for seeding of the playoff finals.
- g. The top seed in each pool will play for the Cup in a final for 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup>, the second seed in each pool will play for 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup>, and so on for all teams in the pooled games.
- h. Where the pools have a mismatched number of teams, the bottom team in the larger pool will be automatically disqualified from the play-off finals.

## 2. Eligibility

- a. All players, coaches and officials must be registered members of the Isle of Man Basketball Association
- b. All players must be at least 14 years old at the start of the season to participate in the Cup Competition
  - i. Players under the age of 16 at the start of the competition must be approved by the Executive Committee to play.
- c. There will be no restriction to eligibility on the basis of gender.
- d. Senior League & D2 players shall be eligible to play in the Cup Competition for any team at no additional cost.
- e. New players, not already registered for the Senior League or D2, must pay a £40 registration fee to play in the Cup Competition and may play for any team in the Competition (which includes their registration fee to the Isle of Man Basketball Association).

#### 3. Rules

- a. Games will be structured as 20-minute running clock halves with game slots of 1 hour.
- b. Teams are permitted 7 team fouls and two 1-minute time outs per half.
- c. All other rules are as per the FIBA rules of basketball as of 1st October 2023

#### 4. Officiating and Scorekeeping

a. Teams are required to provide such officiating and scorekeeping support as necessary for the administration of the league.

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- The Fixtures Secretary, with support from the Association Secretary, will notify all teams of their officiating and scorekeeping responsibilities in advance of the competition.
- c. Where a team cannot provide officials or scorekeepers, they must inform the Fixtures secretary immediately.
- d. Failure to provide officials or scorekeepers may result in points deductions or fines as deemed appropriate by the Executive Committee
- e. A person may not serve as an official or scorekeeper while serving a ban for misconduct as either official, scorekeeper or player.

## 5. Equipment

- a. The Association shall be responsible for the provision of courts, hoops, and scorekeeping equipment for the administration of the Senior League
- b. Teams shall be responsible for the provision of their kits and basketballs.
- c. All players must wear appropriate basketball attire, including jerseys with unique numbers.
- d. It is not necessary for undershirts to match the colour of a team's primary jersey.
- e. The first named team on the fixture shall ordinarily be responsible for the provision of the game basketball.

## 6. Conduct

- a. All players, coaches and officials are expected to uphold the highest standards of sportsmanship and fair play.
- b. Players, coaches, officials, and spectators must always abide by the Isle of Man Basketball Association's Code of Conduct.
- c. Any player or coach ejected from a game will face:
  - i. An automatic one match ban
  - ii. A disciplinary review by the Executive Committee as outlined below.

#### 7. Penalties for Breach

- a. Breaches of the Code of Conduct may be investigated by a disciplinary review by the Executive Committee, in accordance with the principles of natural justice.
- b. The Executive Committee may invite to the disciplinary review such additional members as deemed necessary for the proper adjudication of breaches of the code of conduct.
- c. Disciplinary reviews may leverage such fines or penalties as deemed appropriate for breaches of the Code of Conduct
  - The outcome of a disciplinary review must be communicated to the player's team by the Association Secretary not less than 48 hours after the panel has met.
  - ii. Players or teams may appeal disciplinary outcomes by written submission to the Association Secretary not less than 48 hours after notification.
- d. Appeals must be considered within 7 days.



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- e. Appeals will be reviewed by not less than 3 members of the Executive Committee who did not serve on the disciplinary review.
  - Where such criteria cannot be met, the Executive Committee may invite to the appeals panel such association members or non-members as deemed necessary for the fair adjudication of the appeal.
- f. An appeal may result in:
  - i. A reduction in the penalty
  - ii. An upholding of the penalty
  - iii. An increase in the penalty

## 8. Awards and Recognition

- a. The Isle of Man Basketball Association will present the following awards at the end of the Competition:
  - i. Competition Cup and player trophies

## 9. Amendments to Rules

- a. The Isle of Man Basketball Association reserves the right to amend rules as necessary,
- b. Rules can be amended by majority vote of the Association Executive Committee
- c. Any rule changes must be communicated to all teams within 48 hours of the cote of the Executive Committee
